narrative: in the form of a story

allegory: a story in which people, animals, or things have hidden meanings to explain or teach some truths

metaphor: a way of describing something by comparing it to something else without using the words like or as

simile: a way of describing something by comparing it to something else using the words like or as

pseudonym: a name used by an author instead of his real name

prose: ordinary spoken and written language; not poetry

sequel: a book that continues where an earlier one left off

fable: a brief story that has a moral and uses talking animals as characters

mythical: like a myth; not real

autobiography: the story of a person's life, written by himself
